BRITTEN Death in Venice

Benjamin Britten's final operatic masterpiece is a daring exploration of what it means to be an artist. Britten distilled a lifetime's labour and thought into this story of a distinguished writer's struggle between order and chaos - the life of the mind and the life of the senses. Based on Thomas Mann's celebrated novella, Death in Venice contains some of Britten's most profound and passionate music. Mark Padmore sings Gustav von Aschenbach for the first time, with Roderick Williams in the multiple baritone rôles and Robin Blaze as the Voice of Apollo. The brilliant young conductor Duncan Ward makes his Festival debut. Absolutely not to be missed.
